

EESF of Canada Announces Fundraiser To Be Held at the CECA Convention

Ottawa, Canada – The Elevator Escalator Safety Foundation of Canada (EESFC) will host a fundraiser at the Canadian Elevator Contractors Association's (CECA) 2007 Annual Convention on Wednesday, June 6 in The Westin Ottawa Hotel. The event, being held from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., will be a murder mystery called "Murder Plays A Sour Note." A buffet dinner and a cash bar will be provided.

EESFC has been experiencing tremendous growth and success over the past few years. During the 2005/2006 school year, EESFC educated 78,553 children with the *Safe-T Rider* program. That number represents a 60.34% increase over the 2004/2005 school year.
