Safe-T Rider© Teacher Evaluation Form

**Mobile, AL** – In an attempt to keep the Safe-T Rider© program a viable tool, the Foundation requests response forms from parents and teachers who have children participating in the program. EESF received numerous positive responses in the 2005/2006 school year; 223 responses were from parents and 105 were from teachers.

Barb MacKinnon a teacher from Kanaka Creek Elementary in Maple Ridge, British Columbia said, “*Safe-T Rider*© created a rich discussion of elevator and escalator experiences.” Another

teacher, Tonya Holder from Acreage Pines Elementary in Palm Beach, Florida said, “The children could identify with the issue. They really loved the video.” A parent from Holly Spring Elementary in Pickens, South Carolina said’ “I think it is great for someone to take the time to make safety a fun thing to do and learn.”

The Safe-T Rider© program, founded in 1991 includes a video presentation, poster, program tests, teacher’s guide, lunchbox stickers, participation certificates and child activity books. An interactive web-based version of the program is available at [www.safetrider.org](http://www.safetrider.org).

The program is designed to educate elementary school children on the safe and proper way to ride elevator, escalators, and moving walks. The program runs each year from July 1 to June 30. With the help of many volunteers throughout North America, the EESF was able to reach 450,021 children during the 2005/2006 school year.

A significant portion of the students reached in 2005/2006 were from Canada. This year 78,553 Canadian children were reached. That number represents 17.5% of the overall total. There was also an increase in participation. In 2004/2005, 31,151 student received Safe-T Rider program in Canada. That is an increase of 47,402 or 152.17%.

A large part of the success of Safe-T Rider© in Canada was a result of the efforts by Loraine Frisen from Alberta Elevating Devices & Amusement Rides Safety Association (AEDARSA). Fifty-five percent of the total or 42,954 students were reached in Alberta. Another 21,000 children or 27% were reached in Toronto.

The interactive program that includes all the instruction and activities of the classroom program had 10,270 user sessions during the 2005/2006 school year. That is 65,321 users since the program went on-line in May of 2001.
